

In 1837 Queen Victoria had a new collar made for her by che court jewellers Rundell Bridge & Rundell. It was specifically made to be lighter than existing collars so that it might suit her diminutive stature. The Greater George pendant from this collar is stylistically identical to this Lesser George Badge. Each link of the collar and the Greater George itself bears the maker's mark 'WC' for William Cooper, and the Gothic date letter 'B' for 1837. The base of the Greater George also has the inscription of Rundell Bridge & Rundell. It is abundantly clear that this Lesser George badge was made en-suite with the collar and Greater George to the special order of Queen Victoria in 1837. If further confirmation be needed, the inclusion of the symbols of State carried on the shoulders of the Lesser George, i.e. Rose, Thistle, and Shamrock (for England, Scotland, and Ireland) put the matter beyond doubt as no person other than the reigning sovereign could possibly wear such a badge.

This badge was unknown to Commander James Risk, C.V.O., the official cataloguer of the Royal Collection of Orders and Insignia. He concurs entirely with the above attributions and states that thuis badge was not shown in the Inventory compiled in the reign of King George V.

Major Victor Albert Francis Charles Spencer, 1st Viscount Churchill GCVO JP (23 October 1864 – 3 January 1934), was a British peer and courtier. The son of Francis Spencer, 2nd Baron Churchill, and his wife Jane, he was a Page of Honour to Queen Victoria from 1876 to 1881, and succeeded to his father's title of Baron Churchill in 1886. He served as Lord Chamberlain at Edward VII's coronation I August 1902, and at the Coronation of Edward's successor, George V, he was Master of the Robes. Spencer was a Lord in Waiting from 1889 to 1892 and 1895 to 1905 in both of Salisbury's governments and was created Viscount Churchill, of Rolleston, County of Leicester, on 15 July 1902 (it had already been announced in the Coronation Honours list that he would be created a Viscount). 1 INTRODUCTION

3 RIGHT OF INSEPCTION

3.1 Prospective buyers are able to examine the Goods to be auctioned during the viewing times publicised by Harmers. The Goods may only be handled with the assistance of Harmers' staff and are handled at the prospective buyer's own risk.

4 BEFORE THE AUCTION
